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

The People Inc. Senior Companion Program assists older adults, 55 and up and living in Erie County, who need assistance with daily living tasks. Companion volunteers assist participating seniors with grocery shopping, going for walks, light cooking and housekeeping, while providing a break for caregivers. The program is in need of additional compassionate volunteers, who are also age 55 or over, live in Erie County and meet income guidelines. They receive training and earn a stipend, mileage and meal reimbursement. Volunteers receive rewarding experiences and seniors can remain independent in their familiar surroundings. Through the People Inc. Senior Outreach Program, case management services are provided to seniors 60 years or older who live at home to provide the necessary support to age in place. Seniors enrolled will gain access to appropriate services, including: Adult day care, caregiver resources, food stamps, health insurance /Medicaid, housekeeping and home care services. Sage Management Corporation of Western New York offers subsidized rents to qualified applicants. Eligible applicants must be 62 years of age or older or disabled of any age. The rent, including utilities, paid by each resident will not exceed 30% of their gross monthly income.

Each apartment is carpeted throughout in neutral colors with the exception of the kitchen and bathroom that are finished in vinyl for easy cleanup. The bathroom is specifically designed to accommodate the elderly with safety features such as grab bars. Additional safety features include "emergency" pull cords located in the bathroom and bedroom that enable the residents to summon help from a 24 hour emergency response system.

Common areas of each location include a main entry way/lobby where the mailboxes and intercom system are located. There is a coin operated laundry room on each floor, a community room, public restroom, office as well as a vertical lift to provide accessibility to the second floor units.

Services such as shopping, medical, entertainment and educational facilities are located within the general vicinity. Additional services available include a fire station, police station, hospital and several churches.

COMMUNITY CONCERN

Community Concern of WNY Acquires Hamburg Counseling Services Inc.

Community Concern of WNY announces that it is acquiring Hamburg Counseling Services to ensure increased access to much needed mental health and senior care management services in Southern Erie County. An Erie County analysis shows that between 45% and 92% of the population in Southern Erie County have unmet mental health needs.

Three foundations are supporting this acquisition because of the demonstrated need for increased access to mental health services and their confidence in Community Concern. The Peter and Elizabeth C. Tower Foundation, the Ralph Wilson Foundation and the Health Foundation for Western and Central New York awarded \$185,000 to support the expanded services offered by Community Concern.

Under Community Concern's guidance, the Hamburg site will expand the scope and scale of evidencebased behavioral health and senior care management services," stated Jerry Bartone, Chief Executive Officer. "The acquisition will expand adolescent behavioral health services, offer a growing menu of services to vulnerable seniors and their caregivers, and provide fully integrated care coordination services to Medicaid recipients through its Health Home in Hamburg."

Michael Davern, Community Concern's Board chair stated that this decision is very consistent with Community Concern's direction and rapid growth, and provides integrated services to the people of Southern Erie County while increasing client access through multiple locations.
