Presbyterian Senior Care Of WNY Agrees To Become Part Of Beechwood Continuing Care

Agreement Between Two Prominent Not-for-Profits Will Maintain Operations, Retain Employees

Presbyterian Senior Care of Western New York (PSCWNY) and Beechwood Continuing Care have reached an agreement on terms in which PSCWNY communities, programs and properties will become part of Beechwood. Upon regulatory approval, Beechwood will assume the assets and liabilities of PSCWNY, which include Ken-Ton Presbyterian Village, Kenmore; Presbyterian Village at North Church, Williamsville; and Lockport Presbyterian Home, Lockport. The enriched housing program at Ken-Ton Presbyterian Village is also included in the agreement.

"After very careful consideration and many conversations, we chose Beechwood because it closely aligns with our culture and is a mission-driven, faith-based organization like ours," said Karin Ziegler, PSCWNY president and CEO.

PSCWNY was incorporated in 1957. It employs 85, and nearly 250 individuals reside in its communities. All employees in PSCWNY communities will retain their jobs and all residents will maintain their current living arrangements.

Ken-Ton Presbyterian Village and Presbyterian Village at North Church are both independent living residences for seniors. Ken-Ton is an affordable housing HUD residence. Lockport Presbyterian Home is an adult care facility.

Beechwood Continuing Care is a locally owned, not-for-profit senior care community in Amherst and Williamsville. Affiliates include: Asbury Pointe, an independent retirement community; the Blocher Homes, assisted and enhanced living community; the Wesley Rehabilitation Center, short-term rehabilitative care; and the Beechwood Homes, a person-centered skilled nursing community.

"This initiative is consistent with our mission and strategic vision to be the foremost provider of comprehensive skilled nursing, residential and community-based services in the Buffalo-Niagara area. Having PSCWNY as part of our continuum will strengthen our ability to serve the emerging needs of seniors in WNY for years to come," said Daniel O'Neill, Beechwood president.

Free training program offered

Senior service providers are working with LGBTQ seniors—whether they have chosen to disclose or not. There are 2.4 million people age 65 and over who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender or queer. As baby boomers age, the older adult population is expected to double. As a group, LGBTQ older adults experience unique economic and health disparities. They may be disproportionately affected by poverty and health issues, more vulnerable to neglect and mistreatment, more likely to live alone and be single, and less likely to have children than their heterosexual counterparts. All of the considerations above can be compounded by intersections of race, sex, ethnicity and disability.

Providers should create and implement integrated systems of care that include the unique needs of LGBTQ seniors; ensuring their facility is welcoming and affirming toward LGBTQ older adults to ensure accessible, competent and quality care. The Pride Center can help.

The Pride Center has developed a new, free training program. We have long been a local expert in LGBTQ+cultural competency training, which educates employees on how to be sensitive to the thoughts, feelings and experiences of their LGBTQ patients and co-workers. Our goal is not to change anyone's personal beliefs, but to provide information on the policies and laws that exist to protect LGBTQ people from discrimination.

Through this program, you can be designated as a LGBTQ-affirming senior service provider. We have developed tools for measuring and evaluating an agency's readiness and those who meet the standards will receive this designation and be listed as a resource on the Pride Center's website.
