

New Power of Attorney Law


New York State's New Power of Attorney law became effective on June 13, 2021. The changes are intended to make the Power of Attorney easier to use and clarify the power and obligations of an Agent.

- 1. Existing Powers of Attorney documents remain effective.
- 2. The changes took effect on June 13, 2021. Documents executed by the Principal on June 13, 2021 or after must follow the new statutory form. A Power of Attorney document that was executed by the Principal prior to June 12, 2021 (even though signed by the Agent after that date) will be valid.
- 3. Potential recipients of gifts made through a Power of Attorney are not eligible to serve as witnesses to the execution of the Power of Attorney document.
- 4. A refusal to honor a power of attorney must be made, in writing, to the Principal and the Agent within 10 business days of presentation. The document must provide specific reasons for the refusal.
- 5. If a proceeding is brought to compel the acceptance of a statutory short-form power of attorney, the court can award damages including reasonable attorney's fees.
- 6. The total basic statutory gifting amount is increased from \$500 per year to \$5,000 per year.
- 7. The separate statutory gift rider will not be required for new Power of Attorney documents.
- 8. The record-keeping requirement for Agents has been clarified. An Agent must keep a record (i.e. ledger) of all transactions conducted for the Principal or keep all receipts of payments and transactions conducted for the Principal.
- 9. The Agent will be considered a personal representative for the purpose of health care financial matters. Health care providers and health plans must provide the Agent with information needed to determine the legitimacy and accuracy of charges for health-related expenses and benefits.

The COVID-19 pandemic led to a change in the way we live our daily lives and the way we do business. 

Assisted Living & Medicaid

Do you have a resident or loved one who cannot afford the costs of assisted living? Did you know that New York State Medic-

aid enables residents to live in an assisted living facility at a significantly lower rate than traditional private pay rates? New York State offers various types of Medicaid, including one that can be used in assisted living. "Medicaid is a health insurance plan for New Yorkers who cannot afford medical care. You may be eligible for Medicaid if you receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or meet certain income, resource, age, or disability requirements." (1)

Certain assisted living facilities

have a specific number of "beds" that fall under the Medicaid license. Some communities accept "Medicaid Pending," while others require applicants to have a year or two of private pay funds before being admitted. While every facility differs in what they offer, New York State sets

the rate each year for the cost of care and the maximum amount a resident can keep while living in assisted living. Medicaid does not make it free to live in assisted living, but rather reduces the costs significantly, from around \$4,000-\$6,000 per month to the state-set rate. For 2021, the New York State-set rate is \$1,278 per month in assisted living. This typically includes all care a resident receives. The most a resident can keep in monthly income is \$1,488 per month, which equates to \$210 per month in personal needs allowance after paying their Medicaid rent. (2) Anything above that would result in a spend-down. There are several organizations that can help you apply for Medicaid, let you know if you qualify, and

assist with navigating the system as it can be confusing and difficult.



If an individual with Alzheimer's or dementia wanders and becomes lost. caregivers can call MedicAlert's 24/7 Emergency Response Team to report the situation. MedicAlert will create a missing person report and activate a community support network including local law enforcement and hospitals



to help locate the person who wandered. If someone with dementia is found wandering, citizens or first responders can call MedicAlert's toll free number on the person's MedicAlert ID to identify the individual and initiate outreach to their emergency contacts. In either case, the goal is to quickly reunite the person who wandered with their family and loved ones. This program also creates a safety net for other emergencies.





We never stop serving the community.

The past 15-plus months have been challenging for all of us, both personally and professionally. Like most NIA members we were deemed essential and needed to find ways that allowed us to continue to meet the needs of the families that suffered a loss during the pandemic.

The continuity of a funeral has been the wake (consoling a family at the funeral home) a service (generally within a religious setting) and then processing to the cemetery for the burial. While COVID changed the continuity of a funeral it did not take away the need for a family to acknowledge the death of a loved one and begin the grief process. The wake was limited to immediate family or no more than 10 people. Most religious settings were completely shut down and we too fell under the 10 person maximum gathering restrictions. We adjusted our staffing levels to mitigate the spreading of COVID, pretty hard to tell a family they need to wait 14 days to bury their loved one because the cemetery is shut down due to COVID protocols. Fortunately we remained COVID free for almost a year.

With the help and dedication of our wonderful staff we were able to meet the needs of a grieving family. Collectively we worked together to figure out how we could provide the much needed service while keeping ourselves and the family we were serving safe and healthy. Today we are a better company based on the challenges we faced, this pandemic has brought us closer as co-workers, by alternating work weeks we were committed to keeping each other and our families safe and healthy. Our appointment based interactions with families allowed us to meet safely, it forced us to get better and more accustomed with the use of technology to interact both internally as well as externally with the general public. We found and embraced a new appreciation for the role we play in the grief process along with the value of what a cemetery represents and how intertwined we are with the community we serve.

We did what all of us had to do, rethink who we are, what we are and how can we continue to meet the needs of the clients we serve. I close with this statement I read some time ago. Change presents challenge and challenge presents opportunity. I hope everyone was able to rise to the COVID challenge and had the opportunity like us to meet and exceed the challenges by accepting the need to change.


