When all Congregate Dining Program locations paused due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Erie County Senior Services started offering a frozen meal alternative as a safe and convenient way for older adults to access a healthy meal. Seniors can choose from three to 10 meals and are available for curbside pickup once a week. Along with providing much-needed meal options, the Frozen Meal Program provides an opportunity to perform a weekly wellness check for all of the participants. Free nutritional education and counseling is made available by the Erie County nutrition staff as well. Thousands of meals have already been distributed at 26 locations across Erie County and the program remains a popular option for those who need it.



For over a decade, the Western New York Coalition Pooled Trusts (WNYCPT) has been helping individuals age in place by securing eligibility for Medicaid services in community settings while maintaining access to the majority of their income and assets. Currently, we have nearly 1,000 beneficiaries using this vital tool, which statistically keeps the aging population out of nursing homes for a longer period than those who navigate their needs alone.

If you or your clients are living in a community setting and are disabled, the WNYCPT is a tool that can be used to divert excess income and resources above Medicaid and SSI levels in order to maintain eligibility for these benefits. Once diverted, the funds can be used to make purchases and payments on behalf of the beneficiary.

WNYCPT has three trustees: Center for Elder Law & Justice, People, Inc, and Key Bank. Together, these trustees have several decades of experience helping older adults and people with disabilities.

Companion Call Program

At FeedMore WNY, limiting the interactions between our home delivered meal clients and home delivered meal volunteers due to COVID-19 was a challenging adjustment. Our volunteers are the only people many of our clients, whom are older adults, get to interact with in a given day, and our volunteers deeply missed



connecting with the clients they had grown close to. Our Companion Call Program was developed to have volunteers call our home delivered meal clients and check on their well-being, see how they were managing during the pandemic and to chat about daily life.

The changing state of the pandemic does not change the limited personal contact our clients get. Since most of our clients are homebound, live alone, and may not have family, friends or neighbors that they speak with often – FeedMore WNY has opted to continue our Companion Call Program.

A list of clients is provided to our volunteers, who call clients to check in and see how they're doing. Conversations begin with topics such as how they are enjoying the meals and often lead to clients sharing what is going on in their lives. Volunteers keep a log of anything of importance that comes up in the conversation such as food allergies, diet and medical issues that may need follow up. The volunteer logs are sent to our Nutrition and Client Services teams and they follow up on any questions or concerns.

"We have had many clients tell us they appreciate the companion calls because just knowing that someone out there is thinking about them and cares makes all the difference," Sara Carlson, social worker, said. "These calls are also a helpful way for our Client Services and Nutrition teams to learn of individual client concerns, and ways that we can better benefit them. Overall, this program is a simple yet meaningful way to connect with our clients on a deeper level. At FeedMore WNY, we truly care about our clients and this is one more way we can show them that."

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

PATHWAYS PALLIATIVE CARE

Pathways Palliative Care: A Team-Guided Path for Illness Management & Comfort

Palliative care and hospice care share a similar focus, however palliative care is initiated earlier in the illness process, rather than just at end of life, and patients can still receive chemotherapy or dialysis.

For Western New Yorkers with serious, progressive illnesses, it can be challenging to navigate the health care system. The extensive paperwork and variety of medical decisions can make finding and securing the needed services a difficult time. When a chronic condition impacts quality of life for patients and

families, contacting Pathways palliative care enables them to receive the comprehensive care and support that fits their needs.

Chronic illnesses often lead to patients cycling in and out of the emergency room or hospital. Some examples of diseases for which palliative care proves especially effective include:

- Cancer
- Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease
- Congestive heart failure

for any condition changes.

Dementia

• Neurological disorders, including ALS & MS Anyone can make a referral to Pathways palliative care. When doctors refer patients, they are not relinquishing their primary care of that patient, rather, they are receiving a supplemental team of experts that implements additional services and resources. They collaborate with primary care physicians and specialists to create a care plan to keep patients independent at home. They serve as an extra set of eyes and hands to lighten a practice's workload and can give doctors alerts

When patients enroll in palliative care, which is often covered by health insurance, they receive case management to reduce discomfort and hospitalizations. The primary goal is to alleviate distress associated with advanced illnesses. A cross-functional team develops a care plan for the patient's home or long-term care facilities to prevent trips to the emergency room or hospital admissions and mitigate symptoms such as:







- Shortness of breath
- Loss of appetite
- Constipation
- Emotional needs and spiritual concerns

Pathways addresses mental, emotional, social and spiritual issues. A medical director performs consultations to review a patient's stage in the disease process and medical needs. Registered nurses make monthly visits in the home or assisted living facility to assess what is bothering them while anticipating needs and ensuring appropriate medications are

available. Patients also have access to a social worker who will assist them with accessing necessary resources, applying for Medicaid and obtaining personal care aide services and social or medical transportation. Social orkers also help prepare advance directives also help prepare advance directives

workers also help prepare advance directives while guiding families and connecting them to community resources, personal care aides and medical or social transportation.

Sorting through the landscape of health care organizations can be overwhelming for individuals to find the proper assistance they need. Chronic illness educators spend extensive time counseling patients, answering questions and responding to concerns regarding the illness and its prognosis. They take pride in teaching patients and families about the disease process and treatment options.

Another benefit is that staff can visit patients after they are discharged from the hospital to help avoid additional hospitalizations. Nurses help patients avoid exacerbating conditions related to the illness as part of a post-acute care model. Many programs now offer remote patient monitoring through telehealth kits that equip clinical staff with real-time monitoring and evaluation, enabling a rapid response whenever the situation demands it.

The clinical team always strives to alleviate any burden in the family through dedicated, specialized care and thorough guidance at every step of the illness.

Senior Community Service Employment Program

Introduction. The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) assists mature job seekers (age 55+) and their communities by providing part-time community service assignments while supporting local non-profit and governmental agencies.

SCSEP participants earn minimum wage while developing or enhancing their skills while continuing to seek employment outside of the program. Participants have various assignments (job) classifications, such as: clerical assistants, child/adult day care assistants, nutrition and janitorial assistants.

Earning While Learning. Paid work experience allows participants to develop or enhance their skills. Formal and informal training is given on host agency assignments. Our agency provides full financial responsibility (wages, state mandated fringe benefits, workers compensation and general liability) for participants placed in a host agency site.

Become A Host Agency Site. Your agency must be a not-for-profit 501(c)3 or governmental/public agency to qualify. Work sites (host agencies) are selected to furnish supervision, instruction and training for assigned SCSEP participants.

A larger copy of the regimen is supplied each month so the patient can take it to any medical appointments allowing each provider to see what the patient is taking and when.

There is no fee for our compliance packaging service. This program is helpful for those going home after a hospital or rehab stay, those taking several medications a day, those who have difficulty manipulating prescription bottles, or those who need a little extra help to remain at home.
