HARMONIA COLLABORATIVE CARE Harmonia Collaborates to Support Caregivers

A Health Foundation for Western and Central New York (HFWCNY) Aging by Design study found that 90% of seniors want to remain in their homes for as long as possible. In addition, 32% see living independently as their highest priority. Caregivers play an essential role in supporting senior care recipient needs and wishes.



Harmonia Collaborative Care is collaborating on a three-year project,

called "Pathways for Caregivers", to support Caregivers and their loved ones. "Harmonia has served seniors from our inception. We understand the day-to-day challenges of seniors and those who care for them. We are excited to be part of this innovative project", noted Valerie Nowak, LMHC, MPA, Harmonia CEO.

Harmonia, a long-time member of Network in Aging, offers mental health and senior care services to those in need of support in semi-rural southern Erie County since 1971. Harmonia operates out of a main location in Derby, with a satellite location in Hamburg.

Often caregivers suffer from extreme stress and mental health concerns. Research has also found that in their role supporting a loved one many do not recognize themselves as caregivers. An AARP study reported that 17-35% of responding family caregivers considered their health to be fair to poor. The challenge of caring for a loved one can be a rewarding experience while simultaneously being emotionally draining and physically exhausting.

To address these issues, the Health Foundation for Western and Central New York, the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation and the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation came together to create an innovative family caregiver initiative called Exhale. These visionary funders recognized that supporting caregivers and their family member would also positively impact the larger community. Their fundamental driving principle is that family caregivers provide essential support for many older adults living in the community who need extra support and compassion. A respite from their duties is a welcome opportunity for self-care.

Respite programs take many forms in the community. Respite can be more traditional in-home care and companionship, daycare programs or non-traditional community programming that engage the arts, dance and music.

This expanded approach to respite, led to the foundations funding three respite pilot programs as part of their first 2019-2023 Cohort Resources and Learning Community. The effort funds development program activities, timeline, and learning community activities as well as organization project administration. The goal is to help funded organizations work towards sustainability.

The Exhale 2022 – 2025 Cohort Resources and Learning Community includes a collaboration in which Harmonia will work with Cradle Beach and Lisa Rood, an Older Adults Program Developer & Implementation Consultant.

A geographic neighbor to Harmonia, Cradle Beach will act as the lead coordinating agency and provide expertise in respite services at their 66-acre campus on Lake Erie. "Pathways for Caregivers" delivered at Cradle Beach will include activities and support for both caregivers and their loved ones. Lisa Rood will bring her experience in informed respite programming, coordinate recreational, educational and/or fun outings for caregivers and their loved ones and conduct Train-the-Trainer sessions. lakeshore views.

"Cradle Beach is thrilled to expand our longstanding and relied upon respite program to serve caregivers of aging loved ones. The cumulative strengths and expertise offered by Cradle Beach, Harmonia and Lisa Rood provide a one-of-a-kind respite opportunity in the Southtowns for caregivers to take a breath, access peer support and nourish their own health and wellness", offered Ann-Marie Orlowski, LMSW and CEO of Cradle Beach.

Beginning in March 2023, monthly,

four-hour, respite sessions will allow

family caregivers the choice to remain

at Cradle Beach's relaxing campus

or leave Cradle Beach to have time to themselves. Trained volunteers offer

activities and individual care to loved

one's during this respite time. Cradle

Beach's Campus offers a beautiful and

safe oasis filled with nature greenery, trails, activities and the most beautiful

Valerie Nowak is a graduate of the HFWCNY's Health Leadership Fellows Program and Ann-Marie Orlowski is slated to graduate as a Health Fellow in the Fall of 2023.

Harmonia's involvement in "Pathways for Caregivers" will be led by Director of Senior Services, Jennifer Gunia. Jennifer is the 2021 Network in Aging Dr. Evan Calkins Meritorious Award recipient, sits on the Hamburg Senior Advisory Board and has 19 years of experience in senior services in southern Erie County. The Exhale collaboration will tap into Harmonia's Senior case management services which provide monitoring and linkages to community services; and CarePanion program which provides in home nonmedical care and support allowing seniors to remain independent in their homes. Harmonia will conduct a support group for caregivers at the Cradle Beach site while their loved ones are engaged in other activities. The group will be facilitated by a professional mental health clinician from the agency. Additionally, Harmonia's clinical team, including a geriatric psychologist, are well-trained in providing out-patient treatment in person or via telehealth to individuals, families, and groups.

"Harmonia's professional staff takes pride in providing empathic care to help bring balance into the lives of our clients," shared Valerie Nowak.

The NIH National Institute on Aging report on Aging in Place: Growing Older at Home report, identified that assistance with personal care, household chores, meals, money management and healthcare allow seniors to stay in their homes and save money. "Harmonia greatly understands the importance of supporting caregivers and is dedicated to identifying and implementing collaborative solutions, while offering knowledge and expertise to meet the needs of the community," said Jennifer Gunia.

The "Pathways for Caregivers" Open House is on January 26 from 1-3pm at Cradle Beach. All those interested are welcome to RSVP to 716-549-6307.

KenTon Meals on Wheels is looking for individuals to serve on the board as faithful stewards of our mission, vision and values. We anticipate several vacancies in 2023.

The board works along with the executive staff to develop policy, ensure sustainability and provide the support necessary for the most vulnerable seniors in our community to live independently. The mission of KTMOW is to promote the health, dignity and independence of people in the Ken-Ton community in need of nutritious meals. We have over 200 volunteers who contribute a combined total of more than 21,500 hours while making, packing and delivering over 85,000 meals each year.



The Center for Elder Law & Justice Partners with the Alzheimer's Association of WNY

Through the Western New York Alzheimer's Disease Caregiver Support Initiative ("The Initiative") funded by the New York State Department of Health, Center for Elder Law & Justice partners with Alzheimer's Association of WNY and eight county Offices for the Aging to aid caregivers of people living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia.Alzheimer's disease is the nation's largest underrecognized public health crisis, as well as the nation's costliest disease. This degenerative brain disease is the sixth-leading cause of death in America and the only one among the top ten that cannot be prevented, cured or even slowed. The unfortunate reality is that one in three seniors dies with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia. Caregiver supports, like the Initiative, have shown proven success in keeping people living with Alzheimer's disease and dementia at home, where they live longer and happier lives.

Under The Initiative, Center for Elder Law & Justice attorneys provide free legal services and education to caregivers. The legal services offered spans a variety of legal matters, including such topics such as housing, health insurance, income maintenance, employment, consumer matters, and family issues. However, the most common legal issue referred has been assistance with advance planning and the preparation and execution of important legal documents such as Power of Attorney, Health Care Proxy, Last Will and Testament, and Burial Directives. Such documents are vital to ensuring caregivers can fulfill their duty to take care of their loved ones who are facing dementia, Alzheimer's disease, and other cognitive impairments.

This program places emphasis on reaching at risk, marginalized, and historically underserved caregivers. The primary targeted

underserved population of The Initiative are caregivers who reside in rural areas. Rural households face economic challenges such as higher poverty rates, lower median incomes, transportation and healthcare access barriers, and are more likely to live in counties with concentrated poverty. This presents social and economic disadvantages that contribute to higher rates of chronic disease, including Alzheimer's disease and dementia. The Initiative also expands services to minority populations who face health and health care disparities including Black, African America, Hispanic, Latino, LGBTQ+ individuals, Immigrants, Refugees, and American Indians.

Through Center for Elder Law & Justice, legal services are provided in-person, via phone, or virtually, depending on the client's particular needs. For other caregiving support, Alzheimer's Association of WNY provides a comprehensive continuum of community-based programs and services to those impacted by Alzheimer's Disease and dementia including a 24/7 Helpline, individualized care consultations, support groups, education programs, safety and early stage engagement services. At present, approximately 3,200 Western New Yorkers participate annually in these programs. Niagara Hospice House New Residential Wing Opens to Patients



On December 14, Niagara Hospice announced the opening of the expanded residential wing at Hospice House in Lockport. The facility is now admitting patients to the six new suites that brings the total to 16, the maximum allowed by New York State.

"We are very pleased to open the new residential wing and admit our first patients this week, eliminating any additional waiting for placement for these individuals and their families," said John Lomeo, President & CEO of Niagara Hospice. "The added suites are furnished for optimal comfort and convenience like the original wing built 15 years ago, and our staff is ready to care for more patients. Thanks to the incredible community support we received over the last year, we are grateful to have completed this important project to enhance access to community care before the start of 2023."

With the large residential wing now having 60 percent more capacity, Niagara County hospice patients who need increased services or have an insufficient caregiver system at home will not have to wait any longer than necessary to be admitted to receive around-the-clock comfort care at Hospice House.

"This is a special time for our long-time staff and new employees as we embrace the opportunities to provide specialized care and personalized support for many more families," said Janet Ligammari, RN, Director of Hospice Facility Services at Hospice House. "We have always wanted the ability to admit more families, and now that this new wing is open, our staff stands ready to ensure each and every new family that enters the facility will receive the best care and attention throughout their most challenging times."

Since opening in June 2007, the facility has cared for more than 6,000 Niagara County residents and their families. The residential wing originally consisted of eight suites, and then it was expanded to 10 in 2010. The general inpatient wing continues to operate with 10 suites designed for patients needing short-term medical monitoring and symptom management. Each suite receives 24-7 care from staff and features a sitting area and easy-chair sleeper. The facility also has gathering rooms, a kitchen, a chapel and a children's game room.

Hospice House is the only general inpatient and residential facility for hospice patients in Niagara County, and the general inpatient wing is one of just 12 facilities of its kind in New York State.

Since 1988, Niagara Hospice has provided expert end-of-life care and caregiver relief to more than 30,000 Niagara County families facing a terminal illness. Doctors, pharmacists, nurses, social workers, counselors, aides and volunteers collaborate to bring comfort, dignity and guidance that enhances quality of life for the entire family during difficult times. Symptom management and support services are available in the home, skilled nursing facilities, hospitals, adult homes, David's Path at Schoellkopf Health Center in Niagara Falls, Jeanne's House at Northgate Health Care Facility in North Tonawanda and Hospice House in Lockport.

As the only Western New York hospice accredited by the ACHC (Accreditation Commission for Health Care), the organization also offers Pathways palliative care for symptom management, chronic illness education and telehealth to Niagara County residents with serious, progressive diseases. Romanovski stood inside a glass box packed up to his neck in ice for three hours and 28 seconds. The feat was performed on the streets of Wilno, Wilenski, Lithuania. He trained for six months including only bathing in cold water!

• The intense fear of snowfall is called "chionophobia"? It derives from "chion," the Greek word for snow. It can cause extreme anxiety and can be triggered by just a weather report mentioning snow in the forecast.

• Igloos use snow and ice to trap body heat inside, making the temperature up to 40 degrees warmer than the outside air? The Inuit people developed the first igloos (meaning "snow house") centuries ago as a means for hunters to survive the brutal winters in frigid areas like the Canadian tundra. Today, you can rent a romantic igloo near the Swiss Alps with a private bathroom and sheepskin rugs!


