Five Items to Consider Before Buying A Condo or Townhouse

Whether you're a first-time homebuyer or someone looking to downsize, there are some key aspects of ownership that you should be aware of. Below we'll discuss some of the advantages... while also taking a look at some potential negatives to consider before beginning your search.

What are you buying? Buying into this lifestyle is different than buying a house. When purchasing a condo, you are buying the interior space that you will call home, and a percentage of the common areas such as green space and driveways. Condos/townhouses may also include additional space such as a garage or a porch. Your Realtor can explain exactly what you are purchasing. Additionally, condos frequently have extra amenities that you will share with other condo owners, such as pools and/or tennis courts. Some communities are also gated for added security.

Less maintenance means more free time. When you purchase a house, you need to prepare yourself for all the maintenance work that comes along with homeownership. If you do not enjoy cutting the lawn, maintaining the landscaping, watering the grass, planting flowers and shoveling snow, then you may want to consider a living situation like this where the outdoor workload is managed. That maintenance, however, comes at an additional cost which we'll discuss under the next heading.

Homeowner's Association (HOA). The homeowner's association is governed by a board of directors elected by the owners who will make important decisions on behalf of the entire group. This board will meet regularly and set an annual budget for the care and maintenance of the common areas as well as putting away sufficient reserves for major improvements. The directors also establish and implement policy (such as policies on pet ownership and rental of units) for the HOA. A monthly fee that all owners pay to the homeowner's association allows the directors to complete their assigned tasks on behalf of all. Make sure and

utilize the 5 day period in our standard contract for review of financial statements, minutes of board meetings and declaration and rules of the HOA. If you have questions, be sure to direct them to your real estate attorney.

What is a special assessment? This can at times be an additional fee that all owners will be asked to pay for a set period of time when sufficient reserves are not present in the HOA accounts to replace a roof, driveway, windows or a boiler. While certainly not popular among HOA members, these additional costs are frequently unavoidable once they present themselves. A good question to ask prior to purchase is "What is the history of special assessments for this HOA?" The answers can vary greatly and are an indicator of the quality of management over an extended period of time.

Do I need to purchase insurance for my unit? Whether you're living in an apartment, condo, townhouse or single-family home, you should always be sufficiently insured to cover any losses that may occur. In an HOA setting, there are typically two types of insurance, one purchased by the individual to cover the interior space of their condo and belongings, and a master insurance policy paid for by all the members to provide coverage for common areas.

This type of living has amazing advantages for the right person. I'd strongly encourage anyone considering this to write down their reasons for or against and examine them over a month or two prior to settling on a course of action.





TRUSTED CHOICE HOMECARE

Consumer Directed Personal Assistance, or CDPAP, is a great program for individuals on Medicaid who want to direct their own care. The program allows qualified consumers to hire and direct their own personal care aid.

But what if you don't have, or can't find a personal care aid to be your caregiver?

If you want to take advantage of the program, but you don't have a caregiver in mind or available to you, don't worry. We've put together a few places to begin your search for an aid on your own.

Use Online Job Boards to Find a Personal Care Aid. Like any other employer searching for help, you can use online hiring sites and job boards to search for an aid. Sites like Care.com, Indeed, ZipRecruiter, and Monster allow you to create and post a job to a large, online audience. There are pros and cons to using online job boards to find a personal care aid.

Use Newspaper Ads to Find a Personal Care Aid. Your local community newspaper is a great place to advertise your need for a personal care aid. Even if qualified personal care aid does not read your ad, someone in their life may share it with them. This brings us to our next method – word of mouth!

Use Word of Mouth to Find a Personal Care Aid. When all else fails, you

can always rely on acquaintances, neighbors, friends, and family to spread the word about your need for a personal care aid! Let as many people in your life as possible know that you are looking for a personal care aid, and ask them to spread the word to everyone they know.

Use Community Bulletins to Find a Personal Care Aid. Your local coffee shop, hair salon, grocery store, gym, laundromat, bookstore, library, senior center, or apartment complex will very likely have a community bulletin board that members of the community can use to spread information. 

DID YOU KNOW? . . . ALL THINGS SPRING EDITION!






