



## **GREG OLSEN**

Acting Director, New York State Office for the Aging Keynote speaker

Greg Olsen is the acting director of the New York State Office for the Aging (NYSOFA). In this role, he is responsible for the development, implementation, and administration of programs and policies that help older New Yorkers and overseeing the administration of federal and state funded programs that assist more than 4.6 million older adults and 4+ million informal caregivers across New York State. Working with public and private partners at the state and local level, Greg is leading the effort to

combat ageism, generalizations, and stereotypes about what aging is and demonstrating the value of not only the older population to their families, communities, and the state, but also the value of the network of aging services professionals in addressing social determinants of health and their role in helping older adults maintain their independence with dignity. Under Greg's leadership, many innovative projects have been launched to improve the lives of older adults and their families including combatting isolation, loneliness and depression, lifelong learning opportunities, innovative projects supporting working and non-working caregivers that are being replicated across the nation. He led NYS pandemic response efforts for older adults and he speaks regularly throughout New York State and across the nation about how New York frames aging and the way NY serves older New Yorkers.

With more than 30 years of experience in a variety of capacities serving older New Yorkers and their families, Greg served as chief of staff and legislative and policy director for Assemblyman Steve Englebright, former chair of the Assembly Standing Committee on Aging. He was the first executive director of the New York State Alliance for Retired Americans and served as executive director of the New York State Coalition for the Aging, a nonprofit membership organization representing more than 200 communitybased organizations providing non-medical long-term care to the state's older adult population. He received his master's degree in social work with a specialty in gerontology from Syracuse University's Maxwell School.

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

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
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# 2023 RECIPIENT OF THE NETWORK IN AGING MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD

# There's no denying it....life is a journey!

From the moment we take our first steps, to the hills and valleys that we navigate, our lives are woven together by the unique experiences that define our journey.

While many exciting things happen by surprise, it's often the well-planned events that are the most memorable and rewarding. At the McGuire Group's Journeys palliative care program, we believe that end-of-life care should be given the same thoroughness and attention that's given to all the major events in our lives.

"The Journeys program is designed to complement a person's plans and desires while meeting the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of end-of-life care. This includes honoring our patients' wishes regarding comfort and treatment," stated Journeys Director, Barbara Johnson. "Patients appreciate being able to remain at the facility and often form strong bonds with their caregivers."

For Johnson, the development of the Journeys program has been a journey in itself. "The concept was first introduced at our Northgate Health Care Facility in North Tonawanda," she stated. "At that time, we saw a need for a more palliative approach in long-term care, and the company president asked me to expand the program to our four Erie County facilities in 2013."

The popularity of the program grew because of its uniqueness from other end-of-life services. "One advantage is that there's no separate cost, which allows patients to take advantage of rehabilitative programs such as physical therapy, swallowing rehab and other services," Johnson stated. "For example, if a patient comes into the facility with a fractured hip and a terminal diagnosis, Journeys allows them to participate in rehab and ultimately enhance or potentially extend their time in the program."

In addition, patients benefit from 24-hour skilled nursing care that's delivered by physicians, licensed nurses, social workers, therapists and nursing assistants trained in end-of-life care. Ancillary services include pain and symptom management, oxygen therapy, pharmacy consultations and specialized services, as needed.

As a Social Worker, Johnson understands the unique niche that the program fills and the level of peace and comfort that the patients and their families experience. She believes the program's success can be attributed to the staff's personal touch and consistency. "We have the same caregivers getting to know the patients and families," she said. "They spend time one-on-one with them completing life books, reading, visiting, providing music therapy or any number of activities that enhance their overall quality of life." Johnson went on to say that "the program gives families flexibility knowing that their loved one is getting this level of personalized attention."

Over the last decade, the program has helped thousands of people navigate their path with comfort, quality and dignity, making it a Journey well-taken.

The Alzheimer's Disease and Memory Disorders Center (ADMDC), a New York State DOH Center of Excellence for Alzheimer's Disease (CEAD) since 2015, provides state-of-the-art diagnosis and treatment of Alzheimer's Disease and other cognitive disorders. The Center utilizes a multidisciplinary approach to provide compassionate care and support to patients and families affected by Alzheimer's and other neuro-cognitive disorders.

CEAD WNY serves traditionally marginalized communities through collaboration with the UB Medical School health care system (Buffalo General Hospital, Erie County Medical Center, and Veteran's Administration Hospital), Jericho Road, and Evergreen Health clinics. CEAD WNY also collaborates with the Community Health Worker Network to reach these communities.

As a quaternary referral center, the ADMDC provides access to clinical trials and several observational research programs to expand opportunities for patients and caregivers. The Center has also joined the highly selective Global Alzheimer's Platform (top 40 clinical trial sites in the US and Canada), developed relationships with registries and national cohorts, and emerged as the leader in the diagnosis and treatment of AD/D at the regional, national, and international levels.

The WNY CEAD's serves the following counties: Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans and Wyoming. We work with county offices for the aging regarding access to cognitive neurologic care and education for healthcare providers and staff via dementia specific clinical, nursing and social work didactics, as well as a program entitled "Brain Train" which is specifically geared to educating the public about brain health, what is normal vs not normal brain aging, and how to approach your care if are experiencing cognitive symptoms. In 2011 the University at Buffalo opened the Alzheimer's Disease and Memory Disorders Center, the region's first comprehensive center devoted to Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

- 2016 the Alzheimer's Disease and Memory Disorders Center (ADMDC) designated a Center of Excellence for Alzheimer's Disease (CEAD) by NYS Department of Health
- 2022 CEAD designation renewed for an additional 5-years.
- CEAD's service area is the counties of Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans and Wyoming.

### Four-Step Evaluation Process for Memory Concerns

- 1. At the initial appointment the patient and their family member meet with our provider. A complete medical and surgical history (including timeline of cognitive changes) is taken, and a physical and neurological exam are performed. Tests are ordered to look for correctable causes of memory loss (i.e. bloodwork, imaging CT/MRIPET, and neuropsychological testing).
- 2. Multidisciplinary team confers on the patient's case when the tests, imaging and np testing have been completed. A diagnosis and a medical treatment plan is developed.
- 3. 1<sup>st</sup> Follow up appointment the provider explains the diagnostic results and treatment plan followed by a meeting with our social worker.
- 4. Social worker meets with patient and family to learn about current living situation and counsels the patient and family on how to best manage the diagnosis. This information is also sent to the referring provider.
