1) Did you know. . .tomatoes are the most popular home garden crop grown in the U.S.? According to The National Gardening Association, 86% of home gardens include some variety of tomato. And with around 10,000 varieties to choose from, the possibilities are endless!



2) Did you know. . .a watermelon grown by Chris Kent of Sevierville, TN, holds the Guinness World Record for being the heaviest? The Carolina Cross variety watermelon weighed in at a whopping 350.5 lbs. in 2013!

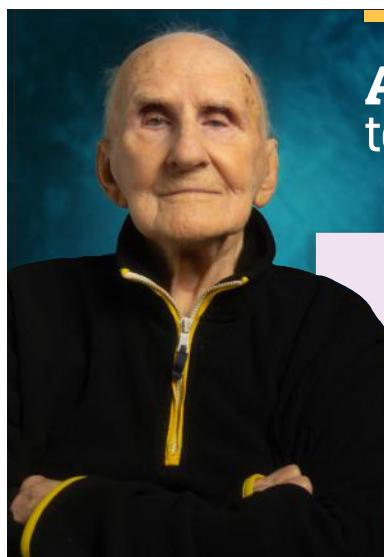

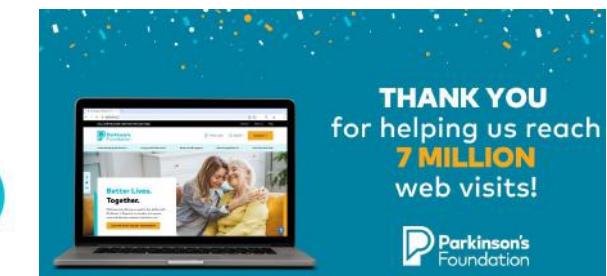

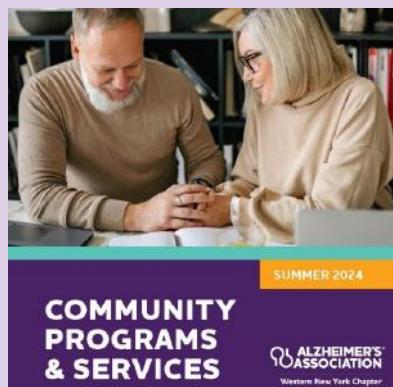

HOW TO FIGHT BACK AGAINST POTENTIAL ID THEFT

The security rupture is a reminder that you can take steps to mitigate the risk to your personal data:

1. Practice safe password hygiene. Too many people fail to heed this basic yet important advice. Passwords should be simple enough for you to remember but not easy for anyone else to guess. Resist using a password with, say, your wedding anniversary date or the name of your dog or cat.

Instead, employ a string of upper- and lowercase letters, numbers and special characters — the lengthier the better.

2. Employ two-factor authentication. Also known as multifactor authentication, this step adds a secondary form of validation, typically through a one-time code provided by a text or phone call or through an app. Do not reveal the code to a stranger.

3. Check credit card statements. Watch out for suspicious or unauthorized charges.

4. Monitor and freeze your credit report. Scrutinize your credit report at least once a year and contact the credit reporting agency — Equifax, Experian or TransUnion — if something seems out of whack.

If you're not actively seeking credit, consider freezing the report, which makes it harder for would-be identity thieves to open accounts in your name. The reporting agencies can supply instructions.

Celebrity Scams in the Age of AI

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is the new shiny object that has captured the world's attention. It's also captured the attention of criminal scammers using it to make their fraudulent schemes more realistic than ever. One area where AI scams are particularly dangerous is celebrity impostor scams.

For many years, criminals have been impersonating celebrities online to steal from fans. Fake celebrity profiles offer fans personal connections, VIP access, investment opportunities or the chance to support favorite charities. These criminals attempt to create a bond through messaging or even a phone call from their "rep."

With the power of AI, these scams can move from messaging to deepfake videos. Recent fake celebrity product endorsements impersonating Dolly Parton, Elon Musk and Tom Hanks demonstrate just how convincing these schemes can be.

Posting on a celebrity's social media account might be exciting, but it could put you at risk of this impostor scam. In whatever way you choose to enjoy your favorite celebs, do so, recognizing that an opportunity to personally connect with them is likely a scam.

So be a fraud fighter! If you can spot a scam, you can stop a scam. You can join the fight by sharing what you learn about preventing fraud with loved ones and friends.

WNY INDEPENDENT LIVING, INC.

A partner of the Veterans Administration Medical Centers in Buffalo and Batavia, WNY Independent Living, Inc. received the sole contract for Veteran Directed Care with the VA. While the Veteran Directed Care model is new to WNY, it has demonstrated success in self-directed care by Veterans across the nation. VA Medical Centers partner with non-profit Independent Living Centers to empower Veterans to employ their own aides (often already being provided by family members).

WNY Independent Living CEO, Douglas Usiak shares, "As an aging service-connected disabled Veteran myself, I am excited to know that my brother and sister Veterans will have the comfort to direct their own homecare needs and remain in their home of choice as long as possible. A secondary satisfaction to being involved in the launch of this program is the opportunity to work with the VAMC in the capacity of a partner, and not just one of their consumers of services. This partnership gives me the opportunity to promote my lifelong passion of promoting the Independent Living philosophy that believes that we all have a right to live in our homes, work in our communities, and engage in society as a person with a disability."

A focus of this program is to reach the underserved rural parts of WNY where Veterans face provider shortages, geographic and distance barriers, limited broadband coverage with limited ability to participate in telehealth, and social determinants of health relative to rural living experiences (i.e. access to transportation, employment).

To ensure a trust-built rapport with Veterans, WNY Independent Living has employed another Army Veteran, Thomas Patterson, to serve in the Person-Centered Counselor role and interface directly with the Veterans in assessing their needs in their homes and communities. Veterans and Tom work together to build a Spending Plan to identify costs for their Personal Assistants and obtain any additional goods and services the Veteran requires to improve

quality of life in their home and community.

The power of this Veteran Directed Care program can be recognized in the experiences of the individual Veterans who are participating in VDC. For example, a 94-year-old Veteran who functions independently in his own home and wants to remain there with some additional oversight for specific household tasks and community access – like going to the library for a new mystery novel, has employed his daughter-in-law for these functions. Another Veteran depends on his granddaughter for activities of daily living and then she needs to go to her job in the community to support herself. Being able to be paid to continue the care she already provides to her "Poppy" will improve the quality of life for both. One thing is certain: their stories are being heard.

Crucial to WNY Independent Living's successful launch as a VDC program, VDC Director Julie Andrews Krieger expresses gratitude for the mentorship of the other providers in the VDC community, including the Independent Living Center of Hudson Valley and VA Medical Center in Albany.

WNY Independent Living will support Veterans across the wider WNY region in Niagara, Erie, Genesee, Livingston, Wyoming, Chautauqua, Cattaraugus, and Allegany Counties. We are proud to serve the Veterans in our community. To qualify for this program, a Veteran must request Veteran Directed Care from their VA physician and Patient Aligned Care Team (PACT) at the local VA Medical Center or VA Clinic and an assessment is completed and referral made to the VDC program.

on the list of the world's happiest people, at number 10, compared to younger Americans, age 30-44, and the under-30s who ranked 42 and 62 respectively.

Why are the rankings so different among the age groups? John Helliwell, founding editor for the Happiness Report and professor emeritus at the Vancouver School of Economics, University of British Columbia, says one reason older adults are happier is that they can brush off negativity more easily and bring what's truly important in life into perspective.

Interesting!

The once-common idea that young people are living their happiest years seems to be a rapidly changing reality in the U.S. Gallup's recent survey data, featured in the 2024 World Happiness Report, suggests that Americans in the oldest surveyed group (age 60 and older) enjoy greater happiness than their younger counterparts. This group ranked in the top 10 globally

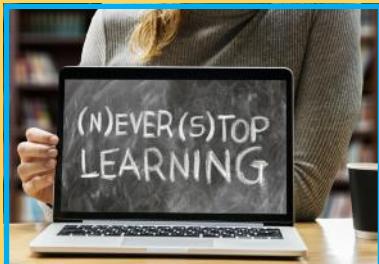

When is it time to call Hospice?

Contacting Hospice can be a difficult and often emotional step for families as well as loved ones experiencing illness. Hospice care is available to anyone with an illness that is more likely than not to lead to the end of life within about 6 months. Examples of illnesses that may apply include:

- Cancer that is no longer being treated or when treatment is not helping.
- Heart disease including congestive heart failure, coronary artery disease.
- Lung disease including COPD, emphysema, pulmonary fibrosis.
- End-stage dementia.
- Neurological conditions such as stroke, ALS.
- Any other illness or combination of medical problems causing a significant and progressive decline.

What are the signs to look for?

Someone eligible for hospice care may be:

- Experiencing more weakness.
- Needing more help to take care of themselves.
- Eating much less.
- Losing weight without intending to.

- No longer receiving or doing well with treatments such as chemotherapy for cancer.
- Frequently in the hospital or emergency room and no longer desiring testing, procedures, and treatments or to return to the hospital.

How do I inquire or enroll?

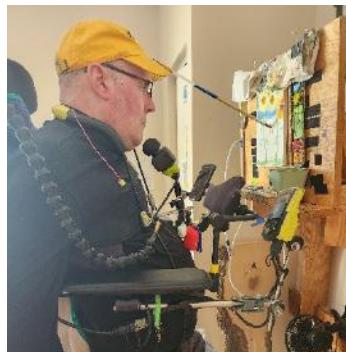
For the Love of Horses

Alan Deacon's story of perseverance, paint, and ponies

If the vibrant yellows and greens of springtime are what make you happy then Alan Deacon has the perfect paint pallet for you! Swing by Harris Hill Nursing Facility, or open Facebook and watch Alan's livestream for a daily dose of color. Alan is an artist and resident at Harris Hill who creates fabulous watercolor paintings. Even more fascinating than his beautiful brushstrokes is how they get there. Faced with MS, and loss of mobility in his arms and legs, Alan paints with a brush attached to the brim of his ballcap, an ingenious invention devised by his son Alex.

A construction owner by trade, Alan was always on the fringe of the artistic world creating custom dynamic drawings and buildings. "Painting is a way to contribute and become relevant again," he stated. While Alan's passion is painting, there's truly a higher purpose behind each stroke. He sells his paintings to support Phoenix Rising Equine Rescue & Rehabilitation, a horse rescue organization he and his wife Karla own at Spruce Meadow Farm. The Deacons purchased the farm in 1989 and opened the rescue in 2009. "My wife loves horses and I love her," Deacon remarked about acquiring the farm. Many of the horses came from racetracks, abusive situations, and kill pens.

Alan was diagnosed with MS in 2005 and became a resident at Harris Hill Nursing Facility in August 2022. As someone who was always on the go, he began looking for ways to stay active. Now the walls of his room are lined with painting caps donned with brushes



of all sizes. He paints with the help of a specialized electric chair that allows him to stand at his easel and work his magic. Alan sells matted prints for \$40 and originals starting at \$75.

As if his unique method of painting isn't incredible enough, Alan also creates videos and photo collages of his artwork using an assistive head mouse device implanted into the lens of his glasses. Alan's electronic chair, head mouse, and a retrofitted vehicle he uses for transportation were made possible by generous donations from members of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Clarence Center where Alan and his wife have been parishioners since 1989. Currently, the Deacons are in the market to replace the 2001 vehicle with something newer and more reliable. The Deacons' organization is a 501(c)(3), and each year they host a variety of fundraisers. They provide lessons, summer camps and other activities at the farm.

Alan's talent is no doubt remarkable given the challenges he faces. But it is his love for his family and the horses that brings him to the easel each day. Most importantly, he gives all the glory to God and operates under the motto, "If I can, I will." And that he surely does!

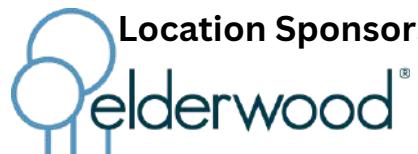

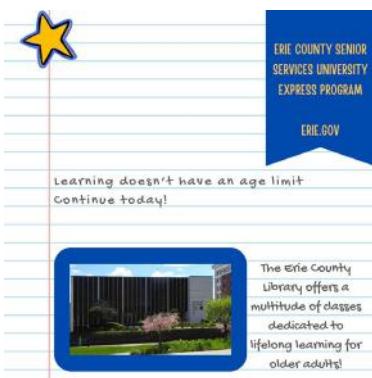

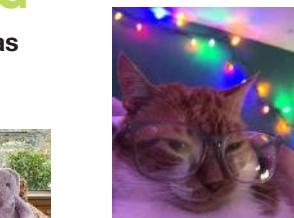
